Regular Meeting November 15, 1999

A Regular Meeting of the Municipal Council of the City of Kelowna was held in the Council Chamber, 1435 Water Street, Kelowna, B.C., on Monday, November 15, 1999.

1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

Mayor Gray called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

2. Councillor Blanleil was requested to check the minutes of the meeting.

3. PUBLIC IN ATTENDANCE

3.1 Terry Flannigan, Chairman & President, BC 2000 Seniors Games re: Update

Dr. Flannigan advised this year's games will be the largest Seniors Games to date with 21 sports and activities. The 3,000 athletes and significant others are expected to generate about \$1.5 to \$2 million economic impact for Kelowna and the surrounding area. The Seniors Games will be held September 6-9, 2000 and participants are 55 years of age and older. Dr. Flannigan advised they will soon be looking to the community for approximately 1,500 volunteers to help with the games.

4. PLANNING

4.1 Planning & Development Services Department, dated November 10, 1999 re: Rezoning Application No. Z99-1054 – Fred & Diana Behner – 119 McTavish Avenue (3360-20)

The Current Planning Manager indicated the property on maps displayed on the overhead projector and outlined the report for Council. The rezoning would legalize an existing suite that is located above the attached garage. At the time of construction the area above the garage was developed as a recreation area but it was subsequently upgraded to a suite for use by family and guests. The applicants are now undertaking the necessary improvements to legalize the suite so that it can be used for revenue purposes.

Council noted the report indicates that although the home on the subject property was identified as a Class "B" heritage building in an inventory prepared by the Heritage Commission, it has not been included in the City's proposed Heritage Registry. Staff were asked to confirm at the public hearing the heritage status of the property.

AND FURTHER THAT final adoption of the zone amending bylaw be considered subsequent to the requirements of the Inspection Services Department being completed to their satisfaction.

4.2 Planning & Development Services Department, dated November 10, 1999 re: Rezoning Application No. Z99-1046 – Johnannes & Irma Schepp; Jakob & Eleonore Jahner and Peter & Ludilla Becker (John Schepp) – 1125 Bernard Avenue

The Current Planning Manager indicated the property on maps displayed on the overhead projector and outlined the report for Council. The applicant is proposing to develop the site with a 4-storey, 26-unit congregate care facility with one manager's suite. Access would be off Bernard Avenue with parking provided in the rear. The applicant has followed procedure for giving notice to the tenants of the existing motel and most, if not all, have already vacated the premises. Planning Department staff have no concerns with the proposed development and recommend favourable consideration by Council.

AND FURTHER THAT subsequent to final adoption of the zone amending bylaw, the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign and seal, on behalf of the City of Kelowna, a Servicing Agreement to the applicant's credit.

The Inspection Services Manager briefly outlined the report noting the applicant has advised that the intent is not to actively promote the lounge. The "A" class license would also allow the hotel to qualify for room service.

6. COUNCILLOR ITEMS

(a) Sand and Gravel Extraction Operation – Mission Ridge Area

Councillor Cannan expressed concern that a sand and gravel extraction permit has been issued by the Ministry of Energy and Mines to a developer in the Mission Ridge area without first following the agreed-upon public consultation process. He noted that the permit is for a substantial amount of material and suggested that a letter be sent from the Mayor and Council asking the Ministry why they did not follow the consultation process.

The Director of Planning & Development Services confirmed that on October 27, 1999, the Ministry of Energy and Mines issued a permit for the Mission Ridge area for removal of 140,000 cubic metres of sand and gravel over a 1 year period. He advised that to remove that amount of soil from the site, a truck with a pup would be required to make about 27 trips per day leaving the site every 15 minutes or a standard truck size would be leaving every 10 minutes. Staff are particularly concerned about that amount of truck traffic on the rural neighbourhood roads. The Ministry had been asked by the City not to approve a permit because there is an active development application for the property and no grading plan has been approved by Council. Staff were informed by the developer that a permit has been issued and are very concerned that the permit was issued without consultation.

(b) 911 Emergency Response

Councillor Blanleil asked that the City Manager follow-up on a letter received from the Firefighter's Union about 911 emergency response.

The City Manager clarified that the 911 committee has agreed that firefighters are to be dispatched when a motor vehicle accident involves an injury. The problem is that the fire truck is not always being dispatched at the same time as the ambulance. The Regional District administers the 911 program and their Administrator has already been asked to investigate the concerns raised in the letter. Council will be informed once a response is received.

Councillor Shepherd suggested that the 911 committee be asked to report to Council at a future date.

(c) Smoking Regulations – Apple Bowl

Councillor Hobson advised he has received complaints about people smoking in the seating area of the Apple Bowl and asked that staff investigate whether there are regulations that restrict smoking in outdoor public facilities.
