1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

2. Councillor Blanleil was requested to check the minutes of the meeting.

3. <u>REPORTS</u>

3.1 Councillor Shepherd re: Chute Lake Security Issues for Residents

Councillor Shepherd:

- Fires from bush parties, excessive traffic and speed are long time concerns of the Chute Lake residents.
- The residents are asking for up to \$1,000 from the City to enable them to hire a security service for the summer.

Councillors Day and Cannan joined the meeting at 9:05 a.m. and 9:14 a.m. respectively.

Council:

- The problem exists around the entire perimeter of the city.
- A strategy is needed for managing public use of the fringe areas.

Councillor Shepherd:

- A resident is seeking help to get a traffic light at the intersection of High/Mountain Roads.

Council:

- Staff to provide a report outlining the criteria for determining when traffic lights are warranted at intersections.
- Staff to include the High/Mountain intersection on their list of intersections being assessed this year.

- Members of Council to advise Clerk's office of any Committee reports to be placed on the agenda.
- Other items to go through the City Manager.

3.4 <u>Committee Reports</u>

Councillor Hobson – Council Water Committee:

- Parks Department staff have implemented water conservation initiatives to minimize maintenance and use of water on sportsfields and parks.
- Conference in Calgary on September 21st on the use of UV technology for chrytosporidium and guiardia treatments.

Councillor Blanleil - Parks Committee:

- June 10th is the deadline for completion of the Mission Sportsfield drainage study.
- The next step is to see if the land can be released from the Agricultural Land Reserve.
- A report is pending re setback requirements for the Mill Creek corridor with respect to the North End Connector.
