3.1 Planning & Development Services Department, dated April 12, 2000 re: <u>Development Permit Application No. DP00-10,019 – Ted Berg/Glen Park Village Inc. – 1940 Kane Road</u> (3060-20)

Staff:

- The intent is to relocate the MacDonalds restaurant from within the shopping centre to a free-standing building proposed for construction on the site.

3.5 Planning & Development Services Department, dated April 12, 2000 re: Program for Seasonal Extension for Sidewalk Cafes (6530-12)

Staff:

- The existing program provides for summer use of portions of the sidewalks in the downtown area for outdoor seating for businesses engaged in food and beverage service within the central business district.
- The intent is to expand the existing program to also allow use of the space on the road right-of-way (i.e. parking spaces and controlled no-parking spaces) immediately fronting businesses for temporary patio seating for a first year trial period of May 15 to Oct 15, 2000.
- A maximum of 5 angle stalls or 3 parallel stalls could be decommissioned on any one block.
- A Permit fee of \$8/sq. m would be imposed to recover lost parking revenues.
- A deck of some sort would be required for the patio seating.
- The patio area would have to be cordoned off from the remainder of the roadway (i.e. pre-cast planters).
- The Downtown Kelowna Association supports this proposal.

Council:

- Consider allowing this program year-round.
- Consider expanding this to the other town centres once the program gets going.
- A policy is needed to address safety issues such as where umbrellas would be allowed, etc.
- Ensure there is adequate room for manoeuvrability where road right-of-way patio seating is next to a parking stall for the handicapped.
- Suggest only have one contact person at City Hall for people to deal with to get a permit, etc.
- Allow extension of the program beyond October 15th, subject to negotiation.
- Consider hand delivering the information on this program to the downtown businesses instead of placing an ad.
- Agreed to a friendly amendment of the motion to reflect that staff will adjudicated submissions and select the best proposals.

 - 5.2 Wastewater Manager, dated April 27, 2000 re: Minimum Lot Size Requirements (5340-04)

Staff:

- Current bylaws require a minimum lot size of 0.8 ha (2 acres) for new lots being created on septic disposal and it is left up to the developer of the property to do the analysis to determine that the land is suitable to develop without sanitary sewer.
- This year, because of concerns about some of the geotechnical reports that have been done, the Ministry of Municipal Affairs have tightened up their requirements and are now requiring that all new lots either have to be minimum 1 ha in size or they must be serviced with sanitary sewer.

- If this requirement is not followed, the City will not be eligible for the provincial grant assistance that we rely on to sewer areas.
- Recommend the relevant bylaws be amended to establish a minimum 1 ha lot size without sewer.
- Staff will report back to Council with the proposed amendments and with a recommendation for dealing with in-stream applications.

Council:

- This is being imposed on a province-wide basis.
- The vast majority of the development area in Kelowna is slated to be sewered anyway so this is really directed to remote areas such as South East Kelowna and McKinley Landing.
- Staff to clarify whether secondary suite applications on properties on septic would be affected by this.
- The Water Committee endorses this policy.
