RE: The Okanagan Valley Wood Stove Exchange Program

### **RECOMMENDATION**

THAT Council endorses the "Okanagan Valley Wood Stove Exchange Program";

AND THAT Council receives, for their information, the report on "The Okanagan Valley Wood Stove Exchange Program".

#### **Background**

The British Columbia Air Resources Branch has designated the Okanagan Airshed as a priority air quality monitoring and research area because of its problems with suspended particulate matter pollution. Smoke from fireplaces and wood stoves is a source of this pollution. The Central Okanagan Regional Air Quality Committee, the Health Region, the Okanagan-Similkameen Regional District and the members of the Hearth Products Association are partnering for a valley wide "Wood Stove Exchange Program" in February 2001. This program will raise awareness and educate the wood burning public about the importance of smoke free burning.

This wood stove exchange program has been identified by air quality and health officials in the Okanagan Valley as one way to get cleaner and more fuel-efficient stoves into valley residences. The goal of the Central Okanagan Regional Air Quality Committee is to reduce wood smoke pollution by achieving two objectives:

- to raise awareness of and educate the wood burning public about, the importance of efficient, safe, smoke-free wood burning, and
- 2. to encourage wood burners to take action to improve their ability to burn wood smoke-free, efficiently and safely by offering information and financial incentives for positive change.

The program will encourage homeowners, through incentives, to trade in uncertified, dirty-burning wood stoves and replace them with new, EPA and CSA certified, clean burning appliances. The changed out stoves are recycled, not resold. The incentives, offered by dealers and manufacturers together, are cash rebates off the purchase price of the new appliance, given at the point of sale. A typical rebate is 10% to 20% or \$75 to \$300.

The program will run for at least six weeks starting in February with newspaper and radio ads as well as intermittent press events throughout this period. An award may also be given to the dealer who removes the most number of outdated wood stoves as a final press hit. In addition, the dealers will be provided with materials such as banners, ad slicks, and posters to further promote the program.

Solid fuel burning appliance experts will also host workshops for the public to educate them about proper burning techniques and the advantages new fireplace technology for improved air quality, burning less wood and creating less creosote buildup. The workshops will also be another opportunity to promote and explain the wood stove exchange program.

The Central Okanagan Regional Air Quality Committee is contributing staff time, advertising funds as well as an information phone line and web site for the duration of the program.
