<u>April 2, 2001</u>

A Regular Meeting of the Municipal Council of the City of Kelowna was held in the Council Chamber, 1435 Water Street, Kelowna, B.C., on Monday, April 2, 2001.

1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

Mayor Gray called the meeting to order 1:31 p.m.

2. Councillor Blanleil was requested to check the minutes of the meeting.

3. <u>PLANNING</u>

3.1 Planning & Development Services Department, dated March 28, 2001 re: <u>Rezoning Application No. Z01-1010 – Cambridge Shopping Centres Ltd.</u> (Marshal Hundert/IBI Group) – 2430 Highway 97 North (3360-20)

Staff:

- The applicant is proposing to subdivide the portion of property north of Enterprise Way and south of Mill Creek to create 8 lots. The intent is for 7 of the lots to be used for development of an auto mall and to retain the remainder lot for future development. Tenants have been identified for 5 of the 7 lots.
- A compromise has been reached between the City and the applicant that would result in an average 25 m wide non-disturbance area along the creek being dedicated in its entirety to the City of Kelowna.
- A Development Permit Application would be processed concurrent with the rezoning to establish guidelines for the uniform development of the proposed uses and address perimeter details such as access, landscaping and signage. Approval of Direct Development Permit would also be required for each individual lot to ensure compliance with the overall approval DP given by Council.
- The lands that were approved for development at the time the Home Depot site was approved will be on freeze until traffic movements are addressed.

• At the public hearing, would like to hear the applicant's plans for protection of the creek during construction and about the proposed filtering techniques for drainage.

3.2 Planning & Development Services Department, dated March 28, 2001 re: <u>Rezoning Application No. Z01-1001 – Debo Holdings Ltd. (Tony Markoff/</u> <u>Planning Solutions Consulting Inc.) – 871 Paret Road</u> (3360-20)

Staff:

- The applicant is proposing to subdivide the 4.37 ha (10.8 acre) property to create a 58 lot single family subdivision.
- The Southwest Ókanagan Mission Sector Plan indicates that construction of the future Gordon Drive extension to the south would be triggered at development of the 905th unit in the plan area. Approximately 180 units have been developed so far.
- Access to the proposed subdivision would be through the extension of Paret Road with emergency access provided north of the extension of Gordon Drive. There would be no direct access from the lots to Gordon Drive.
- The application was reviewed on January 23, 2001 by the Advisory Planning Commission who passed a recommendation of non-support with the suggestion that the applicant meet with the neighbourhood and try to find a mutually acceptable compromise to what was proposed.
- The applicant held a meeting with the neighbourhood on February 22nd and with the exception of concern about the proposed density/lot sizes, staff believe the issues raised can be addressed through the subdivision process.
- Copies of a letter dated March 19, 2001 from the applicant responding to the concerns of the South Slopes Residents Association have been circulated to members of Council.
- Under RU1 zoning the subject property would yield 6 less lots.

Council:

- The results of the evaluation of the bridge over Bellevue Creek to be made available at the Public Hearing on this application.
- The letter from the South Slopes Residents Association indicates that they were not happy with the information they received back from the applicant and that they would like to have another meeting with the applicant.

6. <u>COUNCILLOR ITEMS</u>

(a) <u>Tree Removal from School Properties</u>

Councillors Shepherd and Clark expressed concern about the recent removal of a number of large trees from the Anne McClymont and Dorothea Walker school sites. They questioned whether there was, or should have been, consultation with the City and asked that staff find out the reasoning for removing the trees. Councillor Shepherd also suggested it may be timely to review the City of Kelowna Tree Bylaw and to consider including funding in this year's budget to update the heritage tree inventory.

(b) Fine for Failing to Secure Loads being Hauled to the Landfill with Tarps

Councillor Clark advised that he has asked the City Manager to look into possibly reducing the \$100 fine for failing to secure loads being hauled to the landfill site. Mayor Gray suggested that instead of reducing the fine, some of the fine money be directed to further educating the public on the need for covered loads. Councillor Hobson added that some of the fine money could also be used to enhance the contract the City pays for clean-up of garbage along Glenmore Road. The City Manager advised that there are signs posted to inform the public of the requirement to cover loads being hauled to the landfill site and that the public should be aware that City bylaw enforcement staff will be out watching loads going to the landfill. He further advised that on the weekend, 196 loads were checked and only 3 warnings and 1 ticket were issued.

(c) <u>Tax Exemptions for Fraternal Organizations</u>

Councillor Clark advised that for the first time the Elks Club have found themselves in a position where they may not be able to pay their property taxes because changes to provincial legislation have greatly reduced their ability to generate revenue. They have never applied to the City for a tax exemption and appeared not to know that they may qualify for an exemption. Councillor Clark suggested that staff consider whether a policy would be in order to deal with tax exemptions for these organizations.

(d) Impact of New Provincial Government Gaming Legislation on Municipalities

Councillor Hobson reported that, on behalf of the Regional District of Central Okanagan, he will be sending letters to municipalities around the province regarding the impact of provincial government gaming legislation that disqualifies capital projects from being funded from gaming revenues. Mayor Gray added that he is waiting to hear back from the Minister's office in Victoria regarding the impact of the new legislation on the Rotary Club's commitment of \$350,000 toward the Rotary Arts Centre. Mayor Gray expressed concern that the new legislation could result in other worthwhile projects having to be sidelined in the community.
