3.1 Councillor Shepherd re: Regional District Air Quality Discussion Paper (for information) Executive summary included in agenda package – full document available in Council Reader File

Staff:

- The paper addresses 7 issues and represents 3 years of work and a lot of public input/consideration of the strategies.
- The paper is being presented to the 3 municipal councils and then will go to the Regional Board for ratification.
- Continuing to work with BC Environment to find the more cost-effective way of reducing wood waste without burning it.
- Looking for funding opportunities for acquisition of a woodchipper, possibly including some Health dollars.
- Through the efforts of the Regional Air Quality Committee, many communities in the Valley have their own air quality monitoring stations.

Council:

- Concern that simply reporting the venting index causes confusion for the public; the public just wants to whether or not they can burn on a given day without having to interpret what the venting index means.
- Discussion about the major contributors to poor air quality and the need for Okanagan agencies, municipalities and regional districts to continue to partner with B.C. Environment and Environment Canada and work cooperatively toward finding solutions to improve air quality.
