#### Staff:

- Reading consideration of this bylaw was deferred from the November 27, 2001 Regular Meeting in order to obtain details on programming from the Okanagan Similkameen Health Region.
- The Health Region has agreed to reduce the maximum number of clients from 25 to no more than 20 clients at any one time. Their intent is to run maximum 2 classes at any one given time with random class sizes that would not exceed 20 in total. The 5 staff members would be over and above.

- The Health Region intends to move to a 5-day per week operation once the HRA is approved.
- The Health Region would like to retain the 7:00 p.m. closing time to allow for group sessions for clients that work. There would only be one group up to 7:00 p.m.
- Dr. Weiser says less than half the clients even have the option of driving and less do not drive. Those that do drive have been encouraged to park in the hospital parking lot. The on-site stalls are intended for use by staff. It was the Community Heritage Commission that suggested additional parking be provided on-site and that is why there are 8 stalls proposed. Some of those stalls can be used during client drop-offs or some clients may be allowed to park there for their sessions.

The Health Region has agreed to provide a landscape screen along the rear fence to screen the on-site parking stalls from the view of the neighbour to the west.

The Health Region has agreed to provide a gravel lay-by that would allow two vehicles to pass in the driveway without having to turn around or back onto Pandosy Street.

## Council:

- Staff to ensure that the landscape screen is of sufficient height and density to shield vehicle headlights.
- Suggest that the Health Region include a parking pass for the hospital parking lot as part of the package for programs offered.

- Include management plans to ensure protection of environmental areas;
- Check with the Regional District of Central Okanagan to see if any of the 8 lots north of Stewart Road East that are straddling the power line could be acknowledged as park.
- The block of Bernard Avenue between Richter and Ethel Streets should be identified in the OCP as a heritage conservation area instead of multi-family.
- Add road names to better define town centre boundaries.

- 10. COUNCILLOR ITEMS
- (a) Councillor Shepherd re: Grant Allocation – Central Okanagan Foundation (1840-01)

Councillor Shepherd advised that the Central Okanagan Foundation (COF) is working with the Vancouver Foundation to establish a Youth in Philanthropy Council in the Okanagan. Youth in Philanthropy is a partnership to provide opportunities for young people and community foundations to work together and through this partnership the group involved will gain knowledge and skills, promote volunteerism and philanthropy, strengthen community foundations, and support youth projects at a local level. The COF in partnership with the Vancouver Foundation will provide program development, coordination, training and technical assistance. Council is asked to consider a one-time grant of \$15,000 toward this project using funds from Council Contingency.

The City Manager advised that as at November 20th, there was \$63,417 left in the 2001 Council Contingency account. He also noted that the City's Recreation Manager has advised that there is a Youth Council that the City of Kelowna funds annually through the Recreation Services Division. The Recreation Manager supports the City proceeding with this one-time grant as he envisages possibilities of collaborating and developing partnerships between the Youth Council and the Youth in Philanthropy Council.

R983/01/12/03 THAT Council approve a one-time grant in the amount of \$15,000 to the Central Okanagan Foundation to be allocated by the COF as follows:

- \$7,500 to be added to the Youth endowment fund held by the COF that will provide endowment income for the youth to distribute in future years; \$2,500 to be made available for the Youth council to use for the purpose of
- providing grants to youth projects and programs in 2002;
- \$5,000 to be used to assist with the operating costs of the Youth in Philanthropy Council, including Community Foundations of Canada conference registration for local youth (\$300 per person) (the conference is being hosted in Kelowna in May 2002);

AND THAT the funds be appropriated from the 2001 Council Contingency Account.

#### (b) City of Kelowna Traffic Bylaw – Sight Line Requirements

Councillor Shepherd noted that the City of Kelowna contracts the enforcement of sight line requirements of the City of Kelowna's Traffic Bylaw to the Regional District. She asked that the City Manager review this to see if it is still in the City's best interests to continue contracting out for enforcement of that section of the Traffic Bylaw.

# (c) Okanagan Mission Hall Association

Councillor Hobson noted that the Mission Hall Association has apparently submitted a letter to the City about their need for additional resources to provide lighting that is less likely to impact neighbouring properties and for extra landscaping to act as a screen for the residents next to the tennis courts that would be constructed on City-owned property. He asked that staff review the request and be prepared to respond to that request at the Public Hearing.

# (d) Homelessness Issue

Councillor Cannan advised that members of Council and City staff have met a couple of times with the 'tent-town' group who were recently removed from City-owned property. As a result, it was determined that the highest priority is for finding accommodation for short-term stays for women. A Society that operates from a location on Leon Avenue is interested in providing for that need. The Society board will be meeting this Thursday to discuss the matter further. Emergency Services Coordinator, Beryl Itani, is also looking into what can be done to shelter the homeless in the event of a sudden drop in temperature.

## (e) Nations in Bloom

Councillor Cannan advised that Mayor Gray has sent a fax from China advising that the City of Kelowna placed second in the Nations in Bloom competition.
