- Kelowna Regatta started in 1905 or 1906.
- Goal is to turn Regatta back into the one big summer event in Kelowna.

John Hertay, Downtown Kelowna Association president:

 Reviewed highlights of downtown events and promotions and thanked Council for support of their efforts in the downtown.

Council:

4.3 Planning & Development Services Department, dated December 5, 2001 re: <u>Rezoning Application No. Z01-1057 – Ron Molina/Como</u> Developments Ltd. – 371 Glenwood Avenue

Staff:

- The applicant proposes to demolish the existing house a build a new dwelling unit with a suite.
- The property is within the Abbott and Marshall Street Heritage Conservation Area and therefore a Heritage Alteration Permit (HAP) is required.
- The HAP was not supported by the Community Advisory Heritage Commission; however the applicant has made some minor changes and staff feel the proposed design is consistent with the Abbott and Marshall Street Heritage Conservation Area Guidelines.
- The process is set up to allow the Director of Planning & Development Services to approve this HAP.

Council:

Council's representative on the Community Heritage Advisory Committee advised that it was the form and character of the dwelling unit proposed for construction that the commission was opposed to, not applying the 's' zone to the subject property.

Councillor Clark reported on his visit to Veendam and confirmed that the agreement for re-establishing the Sister City relationship with Veendam is now fully signed.

(b) <u>Treaty Negotiations</u>

Councillor Cannan expressed frustration that the Province is planning to spend \$9 million to mail 16 questions regarding treaty negotiations out to the taxpayers. In his opinion the questions are all no-brainers and this would be a waste of money. Councillor Cannan put Council on notice that he will be bringing forward a motion at the next Council meeting asking that Council send a letter to the Premier stating non-support for the Province proceeding with the referendum and asking that the money be spent more prudently. Councillor Cannan to provide Council with a list of the questions before the next Council Meeting.

(c) <u>Restaurant Proposal – Dilworth Mountain</u>

Councillor Hobson mentioned that apparently the Parks Manager has put together some information on the Dilworth Mountain restaurant proposal and asked that Council get a copy of the information for review before it goes on display.

(d) Nations in Bloom - China

Mayor Gray reported on his visit to Shenzhen, China for the Nations in Bloom competition where the City of Kelowna placed second with gold award status in our population category.
