4.4 Planning & Development Services Department, dated September 3, 2002 re: Local Graffiti Prevention Efforts (0540-20)

Staff:

- The Kelowna and District Graffiti Task Force has been established and has met every two weeks for the last seven months
- The graffiti prevention program provided for in Council Policy No. 302 has been implemented and staff and the Task Force are working on ways to expand and improve the program.
- Two staff members from RCMP support unit are looking at ways the City and police can deal with vandalism and a catalogue of all the different graffiti tags has been created.
- The RCMP have liaised with Kelowna Crown Counsel with the result that Crown Counsel has appointed one individual to deal with all graffiti cases
- RCMP have improved the prosecution of graffiti vandalism as there is now zero tolerance on graffiti vandalism and if the "tagger" is caught charges are laid.
