A Regular Meeting of the Municipal Council of the City of Kelowna was held in the Council Chamber, 1435 Water Street, Kelowna, B.C., on Monday, November 18, 2002.

Council members in attendance were: Mayor Walter Gray*, Deputy Mayor R.D. Hobson; Councillors R.D. Cannan, B.A. Clark, C.B. Day, J.D. Nelson and S.A. Shepherd.

Council members absent: Councillors A.F. Blanleil and B.D. Given.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Gray called the meeting to order at 1:33 p.m.

Mayor Gray advised he would be leaving the meeting early to catch a flight to Vancouver and participate in the Memorial Cup bid for Kelowna to host the 2004 Memorial Cup.

- 2. Councillor Cannan was requested to check the minutes of the meeting.
- 3. PUBLIC MEETING TO RECEIVE INPUT ON LIQUOR LICENCE APPLICATION:
 - 3.1 Planning & Development Services Department, dated October 18, 2002 re: <u>Liquor Licencing Application No. LL02-0009 Fairhaven Enterprises</u>
 (David Habib) 1255/1265 Ellis Street Deferred from November 4, 2002 Regular Meeting

Staff:

- The subject application was deferred from the November 4, 2002 Regular meeting.
- The application is similar to an application in August of this year by the same licencee to relocate the licence to a location on Lawrence Avenue.
- The proposed facility would include a restaurant/eating area in the front of the building and dance floor around 2 bar areas in the rear of the building.
- At maximum capacity the building could accommodate over 500 people but the applicant is only seeking to transfer the existing 304-seat capacity from the Leon location.
- Staff still recommend non-support for the application primarily due to the concerns of the RCMP that transferring the licence would be moving problems into an area where there are no problems now.

Mayor Gray invited the applicant to come forward.

Dan Crocket, representing the applicant:

- David Habib was not consulted on the date for the deferral and was unable to attend today's meeting. He asks that after hearing from the audience, Council adjourn the meeting to December 9th which is the next meeting that Mr. Habib is able to attend.

Mayor Gray invited anyone in the public gallery who deemed themselves affected by the application to come forward.

Ken Thom, 1262 St. Paul Street:

- His concerns are outlined in a letter forwarded to Council but is available to answer questions if necessary.

Joe lafrancesco, 1298 St. Paul Street:

- Also speaking on behalf of his sister who owns the property at 1290 St. Paul Street.
- The proposed cabaret would result in more traffic in the alley behind their properties. Opposed unless the area can be policed better.

Chris Fraser, on behalf of Trish Eddy-Wright who is out of town (owner of 1302 St. Paul Street):

- Ms. Eddy-Wright remains adamantly opposed to the application for the reasons set out in her correspondence.

Bill Shepherd, owner of Flashbacks Nite Club:

- His position of opposition has already been stated. Is here to answer questions.
- Under the new Fire Marshall regulations, the seating capacity in Flashbacks will be increased from 400 to 536. Even with the Snooty Fox licence remaining at 300 capacity, if this application was approved the capacity between the two clubs would be 800+.
- Has always had great concerns about any club in the city being across the street from an existing club.
- Parking is already a problem in the area, although people will always find a place to park.

The City Clerk confirmed that a letter has been received from the Downtown Kelowna Association indicating they no longer object to relocation of the liquor licence to the Ellis Street location.

Council:

- The application was deferred from the November 4th meeting because the Cabaret Proposal Sign notifying the public of the meeting date for Council's further consideration of this application had not been posted on the property 10 days prior to the meeting as required.
- The posting requirement has been met for today's date and, having posted the sign which clearly indicated the application would be considered at today's meeting, the applicant had ample notice of this meeting date yet expressed no concern until today.
- Agreed to proceed with making their decision on this application.
