Late Item 6.2 City Clerk, dated January 27, 2003 re: <u>Counter Petition – Strategic</u> <u>Alliance Agreement (Pepsi Bottling Group) Authorization Bylaw</u> (BL8945)

Staff:

- Advised Council that as of the deadline, 196 signatures had been submitted of which 159 were valid.
- In response to email requests to extend the petition deadline for 2 months, the City Solicitor advised Council has no authority under either the Local Government Act or the Interpretation Act to permit an extension.
- Main concern of the pubic is the nutritional value and the contract provides that City has the right to indicate what the mix of the products sold will be (i.e. Sunrype products and bottled water must be included in the machines.)

4. PLANNING

4.1 Planning & Development Services Department, dated January 22, 2003 re: Zoning Bylaw Text Amendment No. TA02-0007

Staff:

- Proposed amendments to Zoning Bylaw are to address changes to the Provincial Liquor Control and Licensing Regulations.
- Need to differentiate between various types of liquor primary businesses and liquor primary and food primary establishments Propose to create 2 new subclasses related to size under Liquor Primary
- Establishments major with a person capacity of 100 or over, and minor with a person capacity under 100. Rezoning will be required for Major Liquor Primary uses to Liquor Primary (LP)
- version of parent zone.
- Licensee Retails Stores may now carry same range of products a provincial liquor stores.
- Further control over retail sale of liquor through zoning bylaw by requiring a rezoning or Retail Liquor Sales (RLS) version of parent zone.
- Existing liquor primary, major and retail liquor sales establishments will require rezoning to the LP and RLS versions of parent zone and staff will prepare detailed list of the properties to be rezoned.

(a) <u>Current Iraqi Conflict</u>

Councillor Blanleil advised he had written a letter to Prime Minister Chretien requesting that the Canadian military only become involved in the Iraqi situation if there is a resolution by the United Nations Security Council. Since then he has been contacted by a number of residents indicating that Council should authorize a letter to be sent on behalf of the City of Kelowna.

(b) <u>Crossroads Treatment Centre</u>

Councillor Cannan advised Council that the City of Abbotsford is proposing to send a resolution to UBCM about harm reduction centres being located in residential neighbourhoods. The Acting-City Manager advised staff will contact Crossroads Treatment Centre to confirm if there has been a shift in the operation from a detoxification centre to a harm reduction centre so the information can be provided to Council.

(c) <u>Sale of Crown Leases Adjacent to Reservoir Lakes</u>

Councillor Hobson reported on a letter received from Mayor Hein of the District of Lake Country outlining the Province's proposal to sell recreational leased lots on reservoir lakes. Mayor Hein has asked that Council oppose the initiative.
