6. COUNCILLOR ITEMS

(a) Light Standards

Councillor Shepherd suggested that the numbers on the street light poles be painted or somehow made more visible to motorists driving by so if they want to report a light burned out they can identify the pole.

(b) <u>Graffiti Program</u>

Councillor Clark asked for an update on the graffiti program, noting the graffiti in the Okanagan Mission area has gotten worse than ever in the last 2-4 weeks. Referred to staff.

(c) Okanagan Innovative Forestry Society

Councillor Horning noted that the Regional District of Central Okanagan board of directors heard a presentation by Glen Dick, Okanagan Innovative Foresters Society last week regarding their application for an uplift in Allowable Annual Cut for the Okanagan Timber Supply Area. The Board has forwarded a letter in support of the application to the Regional Manager of the Kamloops Forest Region. Since 5 members of Council are on the Regional Board it was felt that there was no need to make the presentation to Council; however, Mr. Dick is looking for a similar letter of support from Council.

Councillors Cannan and Shepherd commented that they did not support providing the letter at the RDCO meeting because they felt that the Board should have heard from the water purveyors first in order to get assurance that they were okay with what was being asked for and that there should also be consultation with Westbank First Nations.

Mayor Gray advised that Mr. Dick talked to all the water purveyors the next day trying to get letters of support from them as well.
