  - 3.1. Presentation of Interim Report dated April 30, 2003 <u>Mayor's</u> Entertainment District Task Force

Norm Letnick, Mayor's Entertainment District Task Force:

- Introduced the members of the task force.
- Outlined the scope of work mandated to the task force.
- Presented the key research findings so far.
- Presented the interim recommendations of the task force from page 9 of their report.
- Outlined the outstanding issues yet to be dealt with by the committee.

Staff:

 The task force wanted their recommendations on the table for public information but some are land use related and may impact the public hearings on certain liquor license related zoning amendment bylaws currently in process. Those related to land use are recommended to be received for information at this time, rather than for actual endorsement by Council today.

Council:

- Agreed to remove "thereby allowing Liquor Primary establishments to remain open until 3:00 a.m." from the portion of the motion extending the length of time for clearing out Liquor Primary establishments from ½ hour to 1 hour giving the opportunity for the closing time for LP establishments outside the targeted area of the downtown to still be extended beyond 3:00 a.m.
- Suggested the Task Force consider sending their interim and final reports to the three Regional Districts and member municipalities in the Okanagan Valley.

- Whether the increased seating capacity already approved by Council for Liquor Primary establishments within the target area of the Downtown has addressed the problems with line-ups;
- Whether Council can require off-sales of beer to be cans rather than bottles.
- Examine whether there is a role for business licensing to set conditions of operation for Liquor Primary establishments (i.e. closing times for sidewalk cafes connected to a LP establishment).

She suggested that the Health Region be asked to provide an update on what is being done in Kelowna to address the problem.

Councillor Cannan asked for a report from staff on their proposed bylaw enforcement of summer noises such as loud boats, boom boxes, etc. for this year.
