1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

Mayor Gray called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

- 2. Councillor Day was requested to check the minutes of the meeting.
- 3. PUBLIC IN ATTENDANCE
 - 3.1 Presentation by <u>Regional Dog Advisory Committee</u> of the recommendations in their letter dated May 2, 2003 (B/L 5880-88)

Councillor Given, Regional Dog Advisory Committee:

- Acknowledged the committee members and resource personnel.
- The committee mandate was to look at the bylaws governing dog control in the City of Kelowna and surrounding areas.
- This is the first set of recommendations. There are other dog issues yet to be looked at by the committee.

Bruce Lange and Dave Duncan, Dog Control:

- Showed photographs of people with dog bites.
- Only the courts can deem a dog to be vicious requires proof of aggression towards humans for that.

Kelly Roth, Regional District of Central Okanagan:

- Reviewed the recommendations in his correspondence.
- Highlighted the proposed amendments to the Regional Bylaw noting the changes introduce stiffer regulations for dealing with dangerous dogs and more lenient regulations for people who are responsible with their dogs. The proposed changes assume that the City will become a participating municipality in the Regional District of Central Okanagan service of dog regulation and control.

Staff:

- The City of Kelowna would continue to handle the on and off-leash parks via Council policy.

Council:

Staff to consider allowing dogs in parks at certain times of the day for people who like to walk/run with their dogs daily and/or on fundraising walk/run events; offering special privileges for responsible dog owners who have well-trained dogs; and requiring the owners of aggressive dogs to have a certain colour collar to alert people to stay back from the dog.

- Recommending a budget allocation in the amount of \$25,000 to fund the initiatives precipitated by the changes to Council Policy 258.

- Encourage the electorate in the Valley to demonstrate their opposition through a steady barrage of letters, emails, petitions and through talk shows, etc.
- Encourage the Minister and MLAs to participate in a town hall meeting to allow the people an opportunity to make their views known.
- Put pressure on the local MLAs to speak out against the government's proposal and ask Senator Fitzpatrick and our MPs to also put pressure on the MLAs.
