Subject: Amendments to City of Kelowna Traffic Bylaw N. 8120 and

RECOMMENDATION

THAT City Council approve the amendments to Schedule 1 of the Ticket Information Utilization Bylaw No. 6550-89 to allow the RCMP to enforce additional bylaws as outlined in the report from the Licence and Bylaw Enforcement Supervisor;

AND THAT City Council approve the amendment to Schedule 13 of the Ticket Information Utilization Bylaw No. 6550-89 to permit the issuing of a Municipal Ticket Information for obstructing traffic flow as outlined in the report;

AND THAT City Council approve the amendments to the City of Kelowna Traffic Bylaw No. 8120 pertaining to the definition of "Park" and "Park Obstructing Traffic Flow" as outlined in this report.

BACKGROUND

The City of Kelowna adopted the Ticket Information Utilization Bylaw No. 6550-89 on March 12, 1990 which outlines in Schedule 1, Column 2 authorized persons who are enabled to enforce those bylaws as designated under each bylaw. Since the enactment of the bylaw the City has expanded in year round activities, events, population and business growth, bringing with it the need for additional enforcement strategies. There has been an increased interest in further joint RCMP and Bylaw Enforcement Partnership which has resulted in a review of current bylaws along with their practices and procedures. We are requesting that City Council approve the amendments to the Ticket Information Utilization Bylaw No. 6550-89 along with the amendments to the City's Traffic Bylaw No. 8120, which was adopted by Council on August 26, 2002.

A) Amend Part 1 Section 1.4.1 – Definitions: (Traffic Bylaw No. 8120)

From: "Park" when prohibited, means the **standing** of a **vehicle** that does not have its engine running whether occupied or not, except when **standing** temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading.

To: "Park". when prohibited, means the **standing** of a **vehicle** whether occupied or not, except when **standing** temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading.

B) Amend Part 4 Section 4.1.2 – Parking Regulations: (Traffic Bylaw No. 8120)

New. **Obstruct** (qq) Upon a roadway in such a manner as to obstruct the free passage of traffic on the roadway.

C) <u>Amend Part 4 Section 4.1 – General Parking Regulations:</u> (Ticket Information Utilization Bylaw No. 6550-89)

New: - Parked obstructing traffic flow Section 4.1.2 (qq) \$30.00

D) <u>Amend Schedule 1 – Designated Bylaws / Enforcement Officers:</u> (Ticket Information Utilization Bylaw No. 6550-89)
