- 3. PUBLIC IN ATTENDANCE
 - 3.1 Leigh Campbell re: <u>Presentation of Limited Edition Artwork Entitled "Your</u> Finest Hour" to Mayor and Council

Mayor Gray:

- The original of this artwork has already been presented by the artist to Fire Chief Gerry Zimmermann to hang at the Fire Hall.

Leigh Campbell, artist:

- Presented Mayor Gray with a print of the painting to hang at City Hall and advised that the painting is going on sale to the public and net proceeds will go to the Okanagan Mountain Provincial Park Fire Recovery Trust Fund.

- Presented the highlights of the 2003 citizen survey and drew attention to the historic trends that are starting to appear.

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4.6 Planning & Corporate Services Department, dated September 10, 2003 re: Official Community Plan Amendment No. OCP03-0002 – Bertha & Douglas Flintoft (622664 BC Ltd./Grant Gaucher) – 2010 McKinley Road, West of Slater Road, and 3650 Finch Road

Staff:

- The applicant is proposing to develop four large properties with a resort hotel and conference centre, wellness village, golf course, vineyard and cottage winery, and education and retreat centre.
- The proposed OCP amendment would change the future land use designation of two of the parcels and allow the applicant to apply to rezone the the properties to a Comprehensive Development zone. The existing Agriculture 1 zoning would remain on the balance of the site which would be used for agricultural uses or left in its current condition.
- The applicant has undertaken preliminary engineering work, environmental assessment, and an analysis on water provision and is confident the property can be serviced in a manner to meet their development needs.
- Staff are concerned because the property is beyond the 20 year scope of the current OCP for urbanized land uses and therefore not considered in capital planning for infrastructure extensions or road networks. It is an intriguing application that could result in an exciting resort type development, but it is premature. The consequences for the capital plan from a infrastructure point of view would be serious. For those reasons the staff recommendation for this application is negative.

Grant Gaucher, applicant:

- The proposed \$250 million project would put Kelowna on the map as a Health and Wellness destination.
- Water can be provided by the Glenmore-Ellison Irrigation District, the main for the sanitary sewer would only be sized to service the subject property with no oversizing, preliminary studies show that all storm water can be detained on site, road improvements would be carried out by the developers and all costs will be borne by the proposed development.
- At 90 acres the proposed development would use about 2% of the urban potential in the area.
- Will hold the balance of the 720 acres plus his family's 160 acres immediately to the north of the Glenmore Highland project in the Future Urban Reserve for orderly build-out of the City.
- Have already done most of the work required for an Area Structure Plan (ASP) and can produce the ASP information concurrent with the rezoning application. Would not want to have to go through the Sector Plan process because of timing considerations and because not everyone who benefits from the plan participates.
- Would like to open phase 1 of the project in time for Kelowna's 100th anniversary in 2005.

Staff:

It is generally the Sector Plan that guides what will occur in the Area Structure Plan. There is no sector plan for this area and staff are concerned that the proposed development would trigger other development to support it and that would open up the entire northern sector of town for development and compromise development that has been planned for in the City's 20-year servicing plan and financing strategy.

6.0 <u>Bylaw 9090</u> - Amendment No. 9 to Fire Prevention Regulations Bylaw No. 6110-88

Staff:

- Alternatives to burning are also being actively pursued; however, the proposed amendment would provide the option of issuing a special burning permit for burning wood waste removed from properties of less than 1.0 ha in size that were damaged by the 2003 Okanagan Mountain Provincial Park forest fire.
- The wood waste would have to be moved to a designated site for burning and all normal rules of burning would apply.

 Concerned about the impact of heavy truck traffic taking wood waste from the burned areas to the selected pit in Crawford Estates. Staff to look at options for dealing with heavy truck traffic at Gordon Drive and Dehart Road, particularly during prime school times.
