- 2. Councillor Shepherd was requested to check the minutes of the meeting.
- 3. City Clerk, verbal report re: <u>Hubbard vs West Vancouver Court Case/Public Hearing Process</u>
- Staff in North Vancouver were routinely bringing back full reports to Council following the close of a public hearing, providing additional information and comments on what was said at the public hearing.
- Previously, case law had determined that staff could 'clarify' questions raised or issues raised at a public hearing. However, the practice in West Vancouver was challenged in court and late last year the court held that absolutely no information could be brought to Council following the close of a public hearing (the door that had been open a crack was effectively slammed shut). That decision is now being appealed but until that appeal is decided, the state of the law is that which was decided at trial in the West Vancouver case. All questions now have to be asked at the public hearing. I staff are unable to answer a question that Council feels they need in order to make the decision, then the public hearing dealing with that item will have to be kept open in order to receive the answer. Council needs to be sure that the additional information they ask for is material to the land use or the issue that is the subject of the public hearing (OCP, zoning, heritage, etc.).

Council:

- Will try to let staff know at initial consideration or first reading what additional information they will be looking to receive at the public hearing.
