8. COUNCILLOR ITEMS

(a) Clean Up of Properties Impacted by Okanagan Mountain Park Forest Fire

Councillor Shepherd advised that she is aware of a couple of properties that were burned out by last summer's forest fire where the owners are absentee landlords and nothing is being done to clean up potential hazards on the properties. The City Manager advised that there is no deadline for clean-up of properties but noted that if Councillor Shepherd would provide staff with the address of the properties staff could follow-up on the concern.

(b) Pesticide Notification Registry

Councillor Cannan enquired whether Council had an appetite to revisit some of the issues in the Pesticide Notification Registry that was recently approved by Council, such as the requirement to obtain a letter from a doctor in order to get 24 hours advance notice when adjacent to a private property that is being sprayed. Councillor Cannan also noted that Earthcare has some suggestions and have asked to meet with Council regarding the program. The City Manager agreed to have the Environment Manager address Council next week to explain how he proposes to handle the Registry.

(c) <u>Financing of New Okanagan Lake Bridge</u>

Councillor Cannan noted that there could be substantial annual interest savings in financing construction of the new Okanagan Lake bridge through public borrowing as opposed to private borrowing.

(d) Future of Okanagan University College

Councillor Cannan suggested that a letter be sent to the Minister of Advanced Education asking when the community can anticipate hearing the details of UBC's proposal to have a campus in Kelowna, and asking that the province commit significant additional resources to improving access to post secondary education in the Okanagan Valley. It was noted that the Chamber of Commerce has put together a list of core requirements for a full status university in the Okanagan.
