Life and Arts Festival and the Memorial Cup Cultural Events Update Subject:

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT Council receives the report on the Life and Arts Festival and the Memorial Cup Cultural Events planned for May 2004 as a component of the City's 2004 Cultural Capitals of Canada Award.

Discussion:

In November 2003 the City of Kelowna received the 2004 Cultural Capital of Canada Award from the Department of Canadian Heritage. One of our many cultural programming initiatives is the inaugural <u>Life and Arts Festival</u> to be held May 6th to 9th, 2004. This multi-disciplinary festival will showcase a broad spectrum of arts and culture within our community as well as featuring artistic talent from throughout British Columbia.

The following illustrates the key components of the Life and Arts Festival:

- 3. Festival Village featuring Street performers

- 7. Kiwanis Music Festival Winners Showcase
