RECOMMENDATION:

THAT Council receive the Declaration dated November 9th, 2004 pertaining to the Kelowna Springs Golf Club Boundary Extension proposal.

BACKGROUND:

On March 4, 2004 Council received a report from the Wastewater Manager regarding obtaining Council's support for including all of Lot 2, District Lot 123, ODYD, Plan 3874 except Plan 43848 (Kelowna Springs Golf Course) within the City of Kelowna municipal boundary in order to be qualified to obtain sewer service from the City of Kelowna. The owner of the property will be responsible for all costs associated with the proposed boundary extension and applicable fees for obtaining the sewer service.

As per Section 20 of the *Local Government Act*, a deadline for receipt of at least 10% elector responses against the proposal 30 days after the last publication of the notice was set to be **4:00 p.m. November 8th, 2004**. Notice of the Proposed Boundary Extension was advertised in the Kelowna Daily Courier on October 6th and October 7th, 2004. The notice was also advertised in The British Columbia Gazette. As of the deadline the City Clerk received 0 elector responses.
