- The applicant is proposing to develop an 11-storey, 46-unit building with some ground floor commercial and 10 storeys of residential above.
- The application provides for commercial uses on north side of the main entrance to the building and on the south side the applicant has committed to make two of the three panels available for public art.
- Because of the mapping error that is now in the process of being corrected in the C7 zone, staff have not pursued the requirement for 90% of the building frontage being commercial.
- The application was reviewed and supported by the Advisory Planning Commission subject to provision of the public art component on the front façade and that has been addressed by the applicant.

- The project as proposed lacks visual interest and is not pedestrian friendly.
- The applicant needs to make more of an effort to meet the commercial frontage requirements.
