Joe Pitarri, IER Planning, Research & Management Services:

- The Strategic Plan is a valuable tool as it sets out the vision for the desired future and the steps for making the vision become a reality. The plan will need to be periodically reviewed and refined/assessed as needed.
- Brief review of the five main components of a strategic plan.
- Overview of the communication strategy that was implemented to ensure high level of consultation with the stakeholders and residents.
- Review of the three goals and their corresponding objectives.

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Staff:

- Presentation of the action items proposed in support of the objectives for achieving the goals of the 2004 plan.
- Outline of the proposed implementation process to ensure the action items are carried out.

Council:

- The pursuit of a clean and safe city is not stated strongly enough.
- The Plan should recognize the value of agriculture.
- Disappointed that the word 'beautiful' was taken out of the vision statement.
- Consider appointing an external citizens group to monitor the City's success in meeting the plan objectives and advise Council on an annual basis. Alternatively, the City Manager could report to Council once or twice a year to advise whether the vision is being achieved or if changes are needed.
- Consider providing an executive summary of the plan so that the vision, goals and objectives can be more easily referenced.
- Consider adding an initiative to recognize the value of youth/children to the community.
- There are no boundaries for air quality; remove reference to 'Kelowna's' air quality.
- Consider adding an initiative for ensuring that the community is 'accessible' to all.

A Bulk Water rate be established at \$0.140 per cubic meter;

AND THAT Council approve the 2005 water rates as to be effective with the first billing cycle in April 2005;

AND FURTHER THAT staff be instructed to prepare the required bylaw for reading consideration by Council.
