- The Liquor Primary establishments listed in Table "A" of the report are the only establishments that are open until 2 a.m. and so qualify for this extension without a further resolution.
- If the ½ hour extension is supported by Council, any of the listed establishments would simply sign a revised Good Neighbour Agreement and forward it to the City of Kelowna with a copy to the Liquor Control Branch (LCB) in Victoria. The signed agreement and Council's resolution of support would make it possible for Victoria to grant the extension. The General Manager of the Liquor Licensing Branch would determine if the trial period becomes permanent or gets rescinded.

Council:

- Staff to remind the managers of these establishments that they are responsible for what goes on in and outside of their facility.
- This extension allows patrons a full hour to finish their drinks and leave. For this to be successful, the establishments have to stop people from loading up with drinks at last call. Staff to relay this concern to the liquor inspector.
- Staff to let Council know after three month's time how many of the establishments that qualify actually apply for the ½ hour extension.
- Agreed that the trial period can start anytime but end October 31, 2005.
