SUBJECT: UBCM Grant – Community Health Promotion Fund

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT City Council authorize a grant application to the UBCM for the Community Health Promotion Fund – Pilot Project in the amount of \$35,000;

AND THAT City Council support the KickStart Kelowna Community Wide Passport to Activity program.

Background:

The UBCM announced the Community Health Promotion Fund – Pilot project in 2005, and invited municipalities to submit an Expression of Interest. The City of Kelowna did submit this expression of interest on September 30, 2005.

On October 31, 2005, Council approved the Kelowna Active Communities Strategic Plan in order to achieve an increase of physical activity by Kelowna citizens of 20% by 2010, which included the Passport to Activity program.

On November 18, 2005 the City received notice from the UBCM that the *KickStart Kelowna Community Wide Passport to Activity* has been approved-in-principle for 2006, and further invited Kelowna to submit a complete application with additional information on the pilot project.

The application requires authorization from Kelowna City Council committing support for the application and for the program.

Discussion:

The *Community Wide Passport to Activity* will assist to motivate the citizens of Kelowna and provide a unique technique to initiate and record physical activity. It fits in beautifully with: "Everyone Active Everyday!" – the British Columbia Recreation & Parks Association (BCRPA) Active Communities theme and provincial tagline. The Passport is aimed at all ages, all levels of income and all ethnic backgrounds and is intended to remove many

barriers to getting active and improving health! There will be a web-based version, aimed at the total community, as well as a printed booklet version aimed at school aged children in grades 4 – 7, which is the age group approved for the provincial "Action Schools" program.

Recreation, Parks and Cultural Services has already begun the strategic process by bringing together key community stakeholders to form the KickStart Kelowna Network. The Passport project includes enhancing existing partnerships and creating new ones to work together on this community wide initiative with:

- 1. School District #23 and all private schools with Grades 4-7,
- 2. Interior Health Authority,
- 3. Not For Profit and community agencies,
- 4. Private and commercial businesses,
- 5. The BCRPA,
- 6. Local Media
