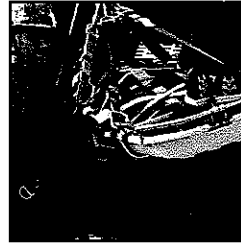




## JIBC Okanagan Campus – Fact Sheet



The JIBC delivers hands-on, experiential learning opportunities for those interested in pursuing and enhancing their careers as justice and public safety professionals. No other public post-secondary institution in the province currently offers the combination of education and training required by practitioners in these fields.

The JIBC has a provincial mandate – our instructors delivered courses in 185 communities across BC in 2005, including the Okanagan. We are pleased to now have a permanent home in Kelowna.

### Program Highlights

**Primary Care Paramedic (PCP) program** – Has had an on-the-ground presence in Kelowna since 1997. 12% of all PCP training across the province in fiscal year 2005/06 has been conducted in the Okanagan.

**Fire & Safety Training** – Partners with local fire departments and industry to host Regional Training Weekend, which provide local firefighters with access to advanced training courses.

**Conflict Resolution** – Okanagan College has been our partner in delivering the JIBC program in the Okanagan since 1999.

**Emergency Management** – A number of JIBC Emergency Management staff were actively involved in coordinating the response to the 2004 Firestorm. Through the Provincial Emergency Management Program – A number of JIBC Emergency Management staff were actively involved in coordinating the response to the 2003 Firestorm. Through the Provincial Emergency Program (PEP), we provide Emergency Management training to public safety professionals and volunteers in the Okanagan.
