- Is a former neighbour of the applicant. The applicant's current residence is very old and is located on the lower parcel (Morrison Road property) which has only a small amount of road frontage. - The applicant would like to build a new house on the upper parcel (Gibson Road property) where there is a better view. The daughter will eventually take over the lower section of the main farm and they will want to be able to move farm equipment between the sites.
- The proposed site would be approximately the same size as the site of the existing house and existing buildings.
- A homesite severance of the existing house would result in more land being lost because of the need to construct road access for the parcel remainder and the owner of that parcel would likely want to build higher up where the view is better.
- The applicant could likely get a homesite severance approved for the existing residence on the lower parcel, but he wants the new lot to be on the upper parcel instead of the lower parcel.

#### Kaspar Moser, owner:

- The proposed homesite severance on Lot 1 (the upper parcel) is in an area that is frost-free and his intention is to farm peaches on the property.

- Clarified that the applicant should be applying for a subdivision in lieu of a homesite severance; a homesite severance application would be turned down by the Agricultural Land Commission based on the proposed new location and the size.
