(SPARC BC) dated December 2005, which indicates increases are required as follows to meet actual shelter costs:

Single Adult	increase from \$325 to \$580
Single Parent with children	increase from \$520 to \$790
Couple, no children	increase from \$520 to \$670
Couple with children	increase from \$590 to \$875

AND THAT Council further recommend to the Minister that these rents be adjusted annually consistent with the average annual change to the BC Consumer Price Index;

AND THAT Council reiterate to the Minister the last clause of its original resolution to UBCM that recommends BC Assistance for adults with disabilities be increased to the same level of assistance available to seniors:

AND FURTHER THAT this resolution of Council be submitted to the UBCM with a request that the resolution be distributed to UBCM member municipalities.

8. <u>COUNCILLOR ITEMS</u>

(a) Regional Transportation

Councillor Day expressed concern that many of the issues raised at Regional Transportation Committee meetings impact the City of Kelowna yet are not being brought forward for discussion by City Council. City Manager to put a reporting process in place to ensure Council receives information on the various transportation issues at the same time as the information is received by the Regional District.

Councillor Day also commented that Kelowna City Council needs to provide advice to the Regional Board on what Council's priorities for lobbying the provincial and federal governments for infrastructure grant monies.

Councillors Day and Clark asked that Council be given an opportunity to debate whether the City of Kelowna should have its own transit contract or continue with a regional transit contract, and to have input on any changes to the contract.

Councillor Clark added that since the City of Kelowna provides the majority of the funding for the Regional District, City Council also needs an opportunity to discuss the cost implications of introducing Bus Rapid Transit on the Westside and potentially funding a Traffic Safety Inspector at the regional level, both of which are being considered by the Regional Board.

(b) <u>Emergency Funding – Shelter for the Homeless</u>

Moved by Councillor Letnick/Seconded by Councillor Rule

R1062/06/11/27 THAT up to \$5,000 be made available through the City Manager to assist churches and other organizations that have facilities but require funds to be able to provide the emergency shelter that is needed for Kelowna's homeless during the current cold spell;

(c) Advisory Committee for Community and Women's Issues

Councillor Gran reported that the Advisory Committee for Community and Women's Issues has been meeting with focus groups and has already identified a shortfall in assistance for single women with no children who have been in abusive situations and are undergoing therapy.
