## Re: Kelowna Municipal RCMP Detachment Policing Activity Report - July 2007

Please note below the policing report reflecting key activities undertaken by the Kelowna RCMP for the month of July, 2007. I will highlight the key statistical data for the most common criminal activities, and provide a short narrative overview of criminal trends and resources.

During the month of July there were two thefts of Bait Cars. On July 12<sup>th</sup>, there was a Bait Car stolen from the downtown resulting in the arrest of two individuals. One individual was also arrested after stealing a Bait Car from the downtown area on July 31<sup>st</sup>.

Furthermore, there were two theft from Bait Cars in July, and Police are currently working on identifying three suspects from the videos. Charges will be forwarded once the suspects have been identified.

### **City Drug Section Highlights**

The City Drug Section was very limited in resources during the month of July due to the reallocation of resources in the Detachment. They continue to follow up with on-going files involving active participants of the drug trade in our community.

#### **Downtown Enforcement Unit (DEU) - Highlights**

Members of DEU conducted 11 drug search warrants in a variety of areas within Kelowna. More predominantly, they were conducted near or within the Red Zone area of Kelowna. Bike Squad assisted with policing the downtown area while DEU conducted the warrant files. All parks have been heavily monitored during this time with more attention given to City Park and Gyro Beach.

#### **Community Operations Support Unit (COSU) - Highlights**

#### Citizens Patrol

There are approximately 60 Citizens Patrol volunteers who are prepared to assist us whenever possible. They are on patrol Friday and Saturday evenings from 2000 hrs to 0100 hrs and will attend Watch briefings on those nights. the OCC is able to contact them should we require assistance. While keeping in mind the mandate of Citizens Patrol is to observe and report (and not get personally/directly involved), if there are circumstances that require things such as a search or surveillance, we can initiate a fan out for assistance.

#### Rutland NIRC Committee

On July 12<sup>th</sup>, 2007 14 individuals met to begin discussing objectives of their newly formed neighbourhood issues resolution committee (NIRC). This meeting involved representatives from the Kelowna RCMP, Community Policing, Parks, City By-laws, as well as a number of citizens in and around the area of concern (namely the Hein Road area). The committee meeting was chaired by Kevin MacDougall, the Community Policing Coordinator for the Rutland area. Four main priorities were established for the Hein Road area as a result of this meeting (in no particular order):

- 1) Speeding vehicles
- 2) Neighbourhood clean-up
- 3) Drug issue

#### 4) Graffiti eradication

A second meeting was held at the end of July which resulted in some favourable comments from the residents of the area. They advised that they had observed a noticeable reduction in drug and related activity in the neighbourhood. They attributed this to the work of City By-Law Officers in the area, as well as the RCMP executing a number of drug search warrants in the area. A third meeting is scheduled for mid September. Eventually, the goal is for the community members to take over the reins of this committee and for the service providers to play a secondary and assisting role.
