- Professional study completed and the summary states that draining property is not feasible. No where to drain excess water too.
- Jim Wood, farmer, leased this property and tried to farm this property but the growth of fruit and vegetables was a complete failure. The reason the crops failed was high water table problems and poor soil. Gave up trying to farm this land after 3 years.
- What would be suitable is affordable housing.

Council:

- Confirmed the owner has owned this property for 2 years. It was bought knowing the existing problems.
- OCP opposes development of ALR land in this location.

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- Without agriologist report cannot determine whether the land cannot be used as agriculture.
- ALR Application before Council today not a development proposal.
