

Regular Meeting – A.M.

February 11, 2008

A Regular Meeting of the Municipal Council of the City of Kelowna was held in Meeting Room No. 3, 1435 Water Street, Kelowna, B.C., on Monday, February 11th, 2008.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Shepherd called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m.

2. Councillor Day to check the minutes of the meeting.

3. REPORTS

3.1 Allan Neilson-Welch, Regional District of Central Okanagan, re: Okanagan Similkameen Regional Governance – Consultation with Local Government Elected Bodies

Guest – Allan Neilson-Welch:

- Primary purpose today is (1) briefing on what the committee has done and (2) get feed back from this Council (will be getting feedback from other Councils as well, and will provide the information to the Committee).
- Reviewed Attachment 1 of the circulated material

Council:

- Regional policing and tourism should be placed on the list in column 1 (must be regional).
- Transportation, isn't that what the province works with? Concerned the Committee is trying to deal with overlapping governances.
- Question raised regarding water and that there was reference to no transferring of water between basins? Is there an opportunity for inter-basin transfer of water; this could provide some benefits and should be under column 2.
- Issue of affordable housing would benefit the most if the entire region were dealing with housing, and it should be broader than housing (other social issues as well). Shelters need to be regional.
- Transportation, water and air quality must be regional.
- Do not want to see regional approaches to be another provincial down load. Also, do not want to see Kelowna as the dominant player where we are subsidizing the region.
- Do not want to see another level of beaurocracy
- The terminology should be changed somewhat and instead of using the word "must" use wording such as priority 1 or priority 2. One word that seems to be missing is sustainability. Even the "must be regional" column should be prioritized.

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Guest – Allan Neilson-Welch:

- Reviewed Attachment 2 of the circulated material

Council:

- Concern raised over connection between representation and financing and accountability.
- Must be a direct and clear line of accountability between electors and taxing authority.
- Include First Nations involvement (large tracts of land).
- The current models work but perhaps more regional support is needed?
- Rural area voices need to be heard.
- Regional Board members once were elected. Are we going back to the way it was?
- The third and eighth bullets in Attachment 2 appear to be contradictory

Option 1 – Single Regional District

Option 2 – Inter-Regional Alliance

Option 3 – Inter-Regional Authority

Council:

- There are areas within the region that don't require municipal services. Already have an Inter-regional authority with the sterile release program, which is currently working and in place.
- The Okanagan-Similkameen is not like Vancouver (not homogeneous and not all urban)
- Need a way to deal with issues without forming another layer of government, but if there is no authority to collect money nothing will get done.
- Is there a fourth option to extend municipal boundaries to current regional boundaries?
- Would option 1 provide for less staff duplication and less elected officials, thus less cost?
- Real issue is rural governance
- key points: accountability; all must pay where regional benefit; do not create another level of government; clarify the uncertainties that exist right now
