As testimony of our collective intention to constructively collaborate, and as testimony of our specific intention to collectively fund the position of the Thompson Okanagan Building and Development Sustainability Advisor, we the undersigned enter this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) as of today's date ______ (Effective Date) between the Cascadia Region Green Building Council (Cascadia), the City of Salmon Arm (Salmon Arm), the City of Vernon (Vernon), the District of Lake Country (Lake Country), the City of Kelowna (Kelowna), the Okanagan Nation Alliance (ONA), the City of Peachland (Peachland), the District of Summerland (Summerland) and the City of Penticton (Penticton).

This Memorandum of Understanding is for a Thompson Okanagan Building and Development Sustainability Advisor position to be managed as a satellite of the Cascadia Green Building Council for the local governments named above.

1. Vision

The Vision for the Thompson Okanagan Building and Development Sustainability Advisor is that this position would provide the following services to the associated local governments:

 To offer sustainable development and green building assistance to each of the associated local governments,

- To help these local governments develop and achieve their sustainability goals,
- To provide the types of services that would be provided by a sustainability department within a larger local government, and to, over time, help to establish a sustainability department or staff person within local governments that is able to provide this.
- To provide neutral, non-profit, non-partisan advice, technical resources and education to the public and local government staff.
- To ensure that these local governments green as they grow.

2. Benefits

There are a variety of critical benefits that this position will bring:

- The building industry today interfaces with all aspects of the environment and is responsible for a significant portion of global impacts to water, energy and resource use. This position will bring the resources and training needed to redefine how our homes, workplaces and communities are designed to be in balance with natural systems. The benefits, ultimately, are to the environment, as it is protected; to the economy, as it is made more robust and competitive by adapting to these issues; and to the community, which is dependent on clean drinking water, clean air and a healthy local ecosystem.
- This position will be located within the Thompson Okanagan, which will allow developing the critical contacts within the building industry in the Thompson Okanagan that will be needed to make significant change.
- This position will be linked organizationally to the largest local green building non-profit in the region, and therefore able to access resources created by much larger municipalities, such as case studies, financial models, an extensive network of experts, and educational programs. - Having close access to the Thompson Okanagan Branch activities will allow this staff person to be supported by a network of green building professionals unmatched in any other public or private organization in BC. To overcome potential challenges associated with serving such a broad region, Cascadia Branches have been established to provide networking and continuing education opportunities for members and industry professionals in their immediate marketplace. Regularly scheduled meetings within each Branch will provide access to green building research and emerging issues that are pertinent to our

region and locale. Currently, Branches are active in Portland, Eugene, Seattle, Spokane, Tacoma/Olympia, Vancouver, Vancouver Island and now the Thompson Okanagan.

3. Why Cascadia Region Green Building Council?

Incorporated as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization in December 1999, Cascadia is one of two original chapters of the U.S. Green Building Council. It is also a chapter of the Canadian Green Building Council.

The Cascadia Region Green Building Council is the premier green building organization in the Pacific Northwest concerned with making change in the built environment for positive environmental impact. As a cross-border advocacy organization we bring a unique perspective to green building by taking a bioregional approach to problem solving. We endeavor to make significant change out of all proportion to our size, by acting as a lever for organizations in both the private and public sectors through creative programs, events and tools. As such we work with local governments, linking them to best practices and leadership from other municipalities through out Cascadia. Municipalities within the Thompson Okanagan will be able to adopt policies, programs, and ideas that have proved helpful and successful in Eugene, Portland, or Saanich. In its work throughout the region, the Cascadia Region Green Building Council is the only organization able to link these resources together.

5. Responsibilities of the Local Governments

The following are the core responsibilities of the associated local governments:

- Providing a place to work. This should mean that the person is provided a desk
 at each of the local governments so that time can be spent and work can be
 done at each of the local governments. This will allow key relationships to be
 built among local government staff and the local community.
- Providing access to key decision -makers within the associated local governments. The suggested structure is that the position provide services to a committee made up of senior decision makers at the associated local governments.

6. Position Description

This position's primary responsibility would be developed by the local governments named above, but would include supporting the sustainability initiatives of these Cites and Regions, and may include:

- Community outreach on sustainability issues on behalf of the local governments and Cascadia,
- Green building and sustainable community policy development, staff education and more,
- Supporting the efforts of the Thompson Okanagan Branch of Cascadia in providing targeted training and education to the professional building community (including but not limited to the engineering, architectural, homebuilder, development, financial and urban planning professionals),
- Providing neutral, third-party assessments of the sustainability initiatives of the local governments named above, and providing public education around successes,
- Fund-raising to ensure that this position is revenue-neutral after the two-year pilot phase.

7. Proposed Schedule and Funding Allocations

Two years of seed funding are required to establish this work. However, it is the intention of all parties that the work would be revenue-neutral by the end of that time. How is this possible? In the words of Jason F. McLennan, CEO of Cascadia:

"It is my hope that after two years the position pays for itself through donations and sponsorships in the community. This person will spend a small portion of their time building up the community of memberships and sponsorships. We still hope to serve the municipalities directly after two years, so we may ask for reduced funding if they still see value which I'm sure they will. 100% of the money will remain in the area up to the funding level of the position – then likely 70-80% after that. "

The approximate seed money needed to start this would be \$130,000 for both years (\$65,000 per year) and this would go towards funding the position (salary + benefits) itself as well as the management of this position by Cacadia's regional Director and CEO.¹

The associated municipalities would fund this position for two years, with the following 2-year commitments from the following local governments. These commitments are based on the population of the municipalities involved:


WORK SCHEDULE/HOURS
