### Southern Interior Development Initiative Trust

### **Mission**

The mission of the Southern Interior Development Initiative Trust is to support regionally strategic investments in economic development projects that will have long-lasting and measurable regional benefits for the Southern Interior.

## SIDIT - Guiding Principles

- Minimize SIDIT operating costs
  - Minimal staff, low overhead
  - Limited promotion, branding
  - Leverage strategic partnerships
  - Outsource funding adjudication/ administration
  - · Teleconference, electronic communications
- Award on merit (with geographic sensitivity)
- Award Criteria sustainable, measurable benefits
  - Employment permanent, full time, high wages
  - Increased tax base
  - Increased revenue generation
  - Diversification innovation, external markets
- Manage Risk
  - Partnerships
  - Syndications
  - Avoid being lender of last resort -- "pre bankability"
  - Collaborative due diligence

## Funding Activity – Fiscal 2007

#### **TOTAL FUNDING COMMITMENT - \$8.6 million**

#### Education Awards - \$5.4 million

- British Columbia Innovation Council SIDIT
  - 9 program elements focussed on academic awards, innovation and commercialization
  - SIDIT and BCIC each contribute \$760,000 per year 2 year initial commitment

#### College Trades and Technology Awards - \$2.4 million

- College of the Rockies, Selkirk College, Okanagan College, TRU joint proposal
- 3 year commitment at \$800K per year
- Accredited trades and qualifying technology programs
- All funding as student awards

#### High School Awards - \$1.5 million

- Administered by 4 colleges
- Engage all School Districts within coverage area
- Focus on trades, technology and academic programs offering dual credits
- All funding as student awards



## Funding Activity – Fiscal 2007

### Pilot Funding Initiative, Community Foundations

- Cranbrook & District, Phoenix and Central Okanagan \$25K each
- Prospect of expanding to all 13 Community Foundations in the Southern Interior

### Southern Interior Innovation Fund - \$ 2 million committed by SIDIT

- private equity fund with target cap of \$10 million
- SIDIT's max. participation rate is 40%
- Leverages from successful OIF
- Emphasis on Technology and Innovation
- Focus exclusively on the Columbia Kootenay and Thomson Okanagan regions
- Seeking investors and opportunities throughout the entire Southern Interior

#### Repayable Financing

- Waveteq \$350K convertible debenture
- RFind \$350K convertible debenture

#### Other Grant Funding

Commitments to 8 projects - \$450,000 Total

## **Pending Initiatives**

- Loan Partnership under development with CFDCs
  - Initial commitment \$1 million with additional \$1 million on same terms
  - SIDIT and CFDC to co-fund loans
  - CFDC to provide administration for share of interest revenue
- Loan Administration Agreement with Credit Unions
  - Provides full adjudication and administration of SIDIT loans
  - Launched April 29
  - BC Central Credit Union facilitated planning/ development
  - VantageOne acting as administrative agent
  - 10 local credit unions throughout S.I. area to participate

#### Pending Projects

- 4 Stage 2 loan applications representing \$3.5 million
- 5 grant applications representing approx. \$700,000 under review

### 2008-2010 Strategic Plan

- Annual Allocation \$7.5 million\*
  - Education Awards approx. \$2.1 million
  - Loans or Equity \$25K to \$1 million per project
  - Grants \$10K \$150K per project : 10% of annual allocation
  - \* funds allocated but not disbursed will be carried over

#### Eligibility

- Grants available to non-profits, charities only
- Minimum of 50% funding from other sources
- Alignment with 10 key sectors
- Located in the Southern Interior
- Demonstrate economic development benefits
- Excluded municipal infrastructure, feasibility studies, health studies, religious, sponsorships, political donations, school facilities

### **Application Process**

### Currently - open call

- 2 Stages
  - Stage 1 to determine eligibility, invite RAC input (6- 12 weeks)\*
  - Stage 2 environmental, business plan, financials, conduct due diligence and make funding decision. (6- 12 weeks)\*
  - \* Processing times may vary depending on scheduled Board meetings, accuracy and completeness of application, need for additional information

- Electronic correspondence preferred

### **Approvals and Communications**

- Stage 2 Board Evaluation, Approval
- Contribution agreement, identifying conditions and terms
- Public announcements generally made when terms and conditions are met.



# **RAC Business Meeting**

### **Term of Office – SIDIT Board Members**

- Within 6 months after the coming into force of the SIDIT Act (February 27, 2006), each regional advisory committee must appoint 4 directors of the Southern Interior Development Initiative Trust (note -such first appointments to have been in effect by August 27, 2006)
- The term of office for directors appointed by a regional advisory committee is 2 years (note -such first appointment term expires August 27, 2008)
- On or before the expiry of the term, a regional advisory committee must appoint 4 of their number as directors to replace the retiring directors
- If one of the directors of the Southern Interior Development Initiative Trust ceases to hold office, a replacement for that director must be appointed in the same manner as that director was appointed. A replacement director appointed under this subsection holds office until the end of the term of the director he or she replaces.
