Re: Kelowna Municipal RCMP Detachment Policing Activity Report - June 2008

Please note below the policing report reflecting key activities undertaken by the Kelowna RCMP for the month of May, 2008. I will highlight the key statistical data for the most common criminal activities, and provide a short narrative overview of criminal trends and resources.

We cannot provide comparison stats for "crimes against persons" as a general category because a search of this nature in PRIME would encompass a different

grouping of crime categories than a similar search under the old information management system.

Downtown Enforcement Unit (DEU) - Highlights

The RCMP Bike Patrol Unit was initiated in the middle of May which compliments the Downtown Enforcement Unit contingent. The Bike Unit will be concentrating their enforcement efforts primarily in the various parks around the City, as well as at the beaches and beach access points. Meetings have been held with the Kelowna City Parks Department to identify key enforcement areas. The City Parks Department has also hired beach ambassadors to assist the RCMP in monitoring the behaviors of beach patrons.

Community Operations Support Unit (COSU) - Highlights

Kelowna RCMP's Citizen's Patrol, as well as those from Citizen's Patrol programs throughout British Columbia, participated in a weekend symposium hosted by the Regional District of Central Okanagan and the City of Kelowna. The symposium featured several workshops to enhance the education and training of patrollers. There are over 60 volunteers with Citizen's Patrol in Kelowna alone, and over 90 volunteers in Peachland, Westbank, and Lake Country. They have contributed over 6800 hours of volunteer time in efforts to help keep our communities safe.

During the month of May we welcomed Colleen Cornock to COSU as the new Mission Community Policing Coordinator. Her new duties will include the organization of volunteers, managing the Senior's Contact and Child ID Program, and dealing with safety and security issues at park and beach accesses while still performing her role of Graffiti Eradication Coordinator.

During the month of May, Kelowna Traffic Services targeted aggressive driving, focusing on

recently improved arterial routes in several locations in Kelowna. Additional enforcement shifts were added to target problem areas on arterial routes. In addition, police conducted several enforcement operations stopping motorcyclists to ensure proper licencing and compliance with equipment regulations. Due to the cooler weather motorcycle activity was not as high as the same month in previous years.

General Information:

The Entertainment District Enforcement Initiatives are continuing with education being provided to officers regarding the importance of Licenced Premise Checks to ensure compliance from establishment owners. The City of Kelowna has assisted with the Entertainment District Enforcement initiatives with parking signs being erected in front of downtown night clubs that are marked for "Emergency Vehicles Only" from 5:00 pm to 6:00 am.

Members of the Kelowna RCMP dressed up in red serge for Senator Ross Fitzpatrick's retirement celebration on May 17th. Members greeted and led the procession of distinguished guests including the Honorable Jean Chretien.

Several police officers, civilian members, and volunteers with the Kelowna RCMP supported Free the Fuzz 2008 on May 23rd and May 24th. We were very fortunate to have the support of several local celebrities, including Mayor Shepherd, Councilor Letnik, and Councilor Rule. The event raised over \$21,000 for BC Special Olympics.

D.A.R.E./Project Hope Program - Here is a synopsis of the 2007/2008 school year: GRADE 3:
