- 3. <u>REPORTS</u>
 - 3.1 Director, Infrastructure Operations, Verbal Report, re: <u>Feral Rabbit</u> <u>Contract Update</u>

Staff:

- Updated Council with respect to the Feral Rabbit Contract
- The contract term was for one (1) year and it is believed that the expiration date of the contact is June 2009.
- Staff, in conjunction with the Bylaw Division, have been working in the Glenmore area to try and deal with the number of rabbits in that area as well as educating the public in this regard.
- Staff have been dealing with both the local SPCA and the BCSPCA and both groups have varying information regarding culling practices.
- Staff originally looked at the American Veterinary Association's method that was provided by the BCSPCA; however upon further discussion with the BCSPCA and local veterinarians, there are varying opinions as to what is considered "humane" and therefore staff decided to base their authority on what the BCSPCA considers "humane" (lethal injection & penetrating captive bolt).
- EBB is now using the penetrating captive bolt method as lethal injection is more expensive and taints the meat so that the carcass cannot be used as food. The BCSPCA agrees that this is a humane technique.
- Advised that more resources may be required in order to proceed with the live trapping and relocation process.
