  - Hot Sun Destinations

- Development
  - 1,205 permits issued with the total construction value exceeding \$65 million
  - two large projects issued

  - in December 2010, the City mailed out 9,013 Business Licences renewals for 2011
- Municipal insurance rates result in annual savings
- 2011 Financial Plan
  - Total Assessment \$24.0 billion
  - New Assessment \$547 million
  - Tax Demand \$96.6 million
  - Average tax increase 2.05%
  - Total Budget \$309.6 million







# A NATURAL, PROTECTED ENVIRONMENT

- Corporate Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions Reduction Plan
  - the City has agreed to achieve Carbon neutrality by 2012
  - reduction strategy to achieve 22% reduction below 2007 benchmarks
  - \$2.8M required
    - payback in approx. 7 years through energy savings, with an on-going cost-savings of about \$423,000
  - initiatives taken over the last 2 years had reduced projected GHG emissions by 1,140 tonnes, or 12%





## A NATURAL, PROTECTED ENVIRONMENT

- Parks Services
  - NeighbourWoods Fall 2010
    - 450 trees sold for planting in citizen's yards
  - major reduction in feral rabbits in 2010
  - Water Board grant for \$10,000 received for Central Okanagan for Canada Goose education
  - new beach access across from West Avenue Park completed Nov 2010

# DIVERSE & SUSTAINABLE INFRASTRUCTURE

- Snow Removal & Ice Control
  - Installed snow & ice control equipment on existing city fleet vehicles to maximize fleet utilization and reduce hired equipment costs
  - 1580 lane km of road, with 753 cul-desac's/dead ends, 393 km of sidewalks, 18 km of multi-use corridors, 11 km of walkways and 110 parking lots to maintain
  - 9 snow events
  - 12 snow spot events
  - Total employee hour spent = 7,025
  - 14 Snow Busters nominated
