Staff Relocation Resulting from Fire at the City Park Pavilion Building

Recommendation:

THAT Council receives the report from the Building Services Manager dated April 13, 2011 regarding the staff relocation resulting from the fire at the City Park Pavilion Building.

AND FURTHER THAT the 2011 Financial Plan be amended to fund the relocation costs of \$140,000 for staff from the Insurance Deductible Reserve.

Purpose:

The approval of the budget amendment to accommodate the most beneficial and lowest cost option for accommodating City staff displaced due the fire at the City Park Pavilion Building.

Background:

A fire causing extensive damage to the City Park Pavilion building occurred on March 6, 2011. Fifteen staff have been displaced by the fire and are currently working within City Hall utilizing free workstations and meeting rooms. This short-term emergency accommodation in City Hall has kept the Design & Construction department functional while a longer term solution could be found.

After analyzing a variety of accommodation options the most beneficial and lowest cost solution is to relocate the Design & Construction department to the City-owned Bruckal Building. This building will remain part of the City inventory for the next 3-5 years and the second floor is

Other intended uses for the Bruckal building include swing space to accommodate a City Hall 3rd floor renovation which would provide enough capacity to move Design & Construction back to City Hall. Although unknown at this time, there is the expectation, some of these costs will be recovered from the fire insurance settlement pertaining to the "extra expense" coverage.

Timing of the move will depend on the availability of a contractor to bring the hard wired fiber connection into the Bruckal Building. Current estimates show the timing to be 8-9 weeks.

Financial/Budgetary Considerations:

Fit up costs to support the relocation include installing a hard wired fiber connection to the building to support large data transfer requirements (\$85,000), furniture (\$32,000) and maintenance (\$23,000 painting, lighting and cleaning).
