AND THAT Council appoints the Manager, Utilities Planning (Andrew Reeder) as the City of Kelowna's designate on the Council;



Re: 18 Month term membership on the Okanagan Water Stewardship Council

We are pleased to inform you that the Okanagan Basin Water Board (OBWB) has requested your organization's participation on the Okanagan Water Stewardship Council (the Council)— a technical advisory committee to the Water Board — for the upcoming 18 month term (May 2012 — October 2013). Please advise our office if your organization is interested in participating and if so, provide the name and contact information of a designate and an alternate by April 15, 2012.

The OBWB is an inter-regional government agency founded in 1970 to promote the shared water interests of Okanagan communities. Its mandate is to "provide leadership for sustainable water management to protect and enhance the quality of life and environment in the Okanagan Basin." The Okanagan Water Stewardship Council was established in March 2006 to provide independent technical advice, analysis, and policy recommendations to the Water Board.

In December 2008, the three Okanagan regional districts renewed the Stewardship Council's mandate and, subsequently, the OBWB reviewed and approved the attached membership roll for the next 18 month term, starting in May 2012.

The great strength of the Council is its diversity and expertise. It is comprised of water user groups, non-profit organizations, scientists, government, First Nations, academics, economic interests, and professional associations. The result is a thoughtful forum on water that respects differences and makes recommendations that benefit the entire Okanagan Basin.

During the past four years, the Council has provided important direction and advice to the Water Board, including the development of the *Okanagan Sustainable Water Strategy, Action Plan 1.0*. The strategy provides an important context for 45 actions to be undertaken by the board and partner governments over the next eight years. The draft work plan for the upcoming 18 month term will be developed and help focus Council efforts to implement the actions in the *Sustainable Water Strategy*.

The Council meets 10 times during the year on the second Thursday of each month and has agreed on a set of guiding principles for addressing water issues in the Okanagan.
