Parks and Public Spaces Bylaw Update



THAT Council receives for information the report from the Park Services Manager, dated June 14, 2012 recommending changes to the Parks and Public Spaces Bylaw;

AND THAT Council gives reading consideration to Bylaw No. 10680 being the new "Parks and Public Spaces Bylaw";

AND THAT Bylaw No. 10681 being "Amendment No. 5 to Bylaw Notice Enforcement Bylaw No. 10475" be given reading consideration;

AND FURTHER THAT after adoption of Parks and Public Spaces Bylaw No. 10680 Council rescinds Dog Walking and Dog Off-Leash Areas Policy No. 258.

#### Purpose:

The Parks and Public Spaces Bylaw No. 6819-91 required updating and consolidation, and has been re-written to form a new bylaw 10680.

### Background:

The Parks and Public Spaces Bylaw No. 6819-91 has been amended many times over the years, and staff felt that it should be re-written. Changes in the newly drafted bylaw No. 10680 include the following:

- Re-written and re-organized, removing references to previous additions or deletions;
- Added new definitions of 'chattels', 'owner' and 'prohibited animal';
- Replaced former definition of 'dog walking park' with 'dog on-leash park';
- Added section 3.7 dealing with unauthorized sportsfield use;
- Clarified the language in sections 3.3, 3.5, 3.9, 3.10, 3.16 and 3.27;
- Added "within any posted speed limits" to section 3.24;
- Added section 3.37, clarifying when a barbecue would be permitted in a park;



- Added sections 3.40 3.43, to further define prohibited activities such as golfing, skiing, sledding, model aircraft, ballooning, any activity that creates a nuisance, and the use of tennis courts for activities other than the intended purpose.
- Section 4.3: added reference to Outdoor Events bylaw;
- Section 4.6: clarified process for park access permits;
- Replaced all references to "Civic Properties Manager" with "City Property Manager";
- Part 5: added seizure of chattels;
- Schedules A-D: rewritten and updated with current pricing;
- Schedules E and F: added list of dog on- and off-leash parks;
- Schedule G: added one Equestrian park;
- Schedules H and I: added an official list of current and future park properties; and
- Overall bylaw language and grammar has been corrected and re-written for clarity.

With the addition of Schedules E and F (Dog On- and Off-Leash Parks), Council Policy No. 258, "Dog Walking and Dog Off-Leash Areas" is no longer needed and should also be rescinded.

The following changes are also recommended to Bylaw No. 10681 with regards to fines:

- Increase fine for section 3.5, make a fire in a park, from \$50 to \$345 to be consistent with the BC Wildfire Act;
- Add fine for Section 3.7, use of a closed sportsfield, at \$100;
- Increase fine for section 3.8, conducting an event without a permit, from \$100 to \$500:
- Increase fine for section 3.9, permit a dog in a park where prohibited, or dog running at large in a park, from \$75 to \$100;
- Increase fine for section 3.10, dangerous dog in a park, from \$150 to \$200;
- Add fine for section 3.13, prohibited animal in a park, at \$50;
- Add fine for section 3.38, use of barbecue outside of a permitted area in a park, at \$100:
- Add fine for section 3.41, golfing, skiing, sledding, snowboarding in a park, at \$100;
- Add fine for section 3.42, creating a nuisance in a park, at \$100; and
- Add fine for section 3.43, unauthorized operation of a balloon or model airplane in a park, at \$100.
- Add fine for section 3.44, unauthorized use of electricity or city utility, at \$100.
