PART 6 - TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES

6.1 Placement and Erection

6.1.1 <u>City Engineer's Order</u>. The City Engineer shall order the placing or erection of applicable traffic control devices where and when necessary in order to give effect to the provisions of this Bylaw and the *Motor Vehicle Act*. Such traffic control devices generality of the foregoing shall also include:

shall include all signs contained in *Motor Vehicle Act* and without limiting the signs to regulate, control or prohibit pedestrian traffic, ridden or herded **Sidewalks** (a) animals, vehicular traffic, and cycle traffic on sidewalks, bridges, walkways, boulevards or lanes, signs to regulate, control or prohibit the stopping of vehicles, (b) Stopping (c) signs to regulate, control or prohibit the standing or parking of vehicles, **Parking** (d) signs to set apart and allot portions of highways adjacent to Federal, **Public** Provincial or Municipal public buildings for the exclusive use of government **Buildings** officials and officer's for the parking of vehicles and the regulation of such parking, (e) signs where construction, reconstruction, widening, repair, marking or other Crew work is being carried out indicating that work crews, or equipment are working Working upon the highway, **Ahead** signs where construction, re-construction, widening, repair, marking or other Construction (f) work is being carried out to regulate or prohibit traffic in the vicinity of such Zone works. signs to regulate or prohibit pedestrian traffic on highways other than at **Pedestrians** (g) crosswalks, (h) signs to regulate, control or prohibit persons using in-line skates, roller skates, **Skates** cycles, skateboards, sleighs, skates, skis or other similar means of conveyance on a highway, (i) signs at intersections and in advance of intersections where it is required to Turn Prohibition prohibit certain movements, signs at the end of one-way roadways to prevent traffic entering the restricted Do Not (j) area, **Enter** (k) signs on highways upon which the traffic is required to travel in one direction One Way only,

normal travel is restricted to the right hand side of the roadway, Traffic signs at the beginning of a zone indicating not to overtake another vehicle, Do Not Pass (m)

Loading	(o)	signs at locations where due to adjacent commercial facilities it is desirable to
Zones	(-)	reserve space for loading and unloading vehicles,
Yellow Curb	(p)	curbs painted yellow as an indication that no person shall stop, park, or leave standing any motor vehicle attended or unattended,
Trucks	(q)	signs in locations where truck traffic is routed, prohibited or restricted,
Maximum Weight	(r)	signs at locations where due to seasonal weakening of road surfaces, obsolescence of bridges or pavements, or roadway repairs, loads in excess of those prescribed on the signs constitute a hazard to traffic or excessive damage to the roads and bridges,
Maximum Speed	(s)	signs at locations where due to limitations of sight distances, road surfaces, traffic flows, frequency of intersections, and driveway, speeds in excess of those prescribed on the signs constitute a hazard to traffic or excessive damage to the roads,
Passenger Zones	(t)	signs at locations where a bus or other transit vehicle stops to pick up or drop off passengers and it is desirable to restrict stopping, standing and parking to such vehicles,
No Stopping	(u)	signs at locations where free flow of traffic is required for the roadway,
School	(v)	signs at locations where it is required to give advance information such as the presence of a school adjacent to a roadway, a school crosswalk, a school maximum speed zone,
Playground	(w)	signs and/or lines at locations where it is required to give advance information of a playground adjacent to a roadway , or its maximum speed zone,
Crosswalk	(x)	signs and/or pavement marking lines at locations where heavy pedestrian traffic crosses a roadway and at locations other than an intersection , such as at schools, playgrounds and public buildings where it is required to control pedestrian traffic,
Angle Parking	(y)	signs and/or pavement marking lines in locations where it is permissible to angle park,
Warning	(z)	signs at locations where it is required to warn traffic of hazardous conditions, either on or adjacent to the roadway or prohibit traffic from using the roadway,
Traffic Signals	(aa)	traffic control signals at intersections and other locations where traffic signs are not adequate to control traffic safely and efficiently,
Taxi Zones	(bb)	signs at locations where due to frequent use by the public, it is desirable to reserve a place for taxicabs only to stop, stand or park to pick up or drop off fares,
Bus Stops	(cc)	signs at locations which identify and direct traffic at bus stops,

	Parking Lot	(dd)	signs at the entrance to or upon highways where provision is made for parking of motor vehicles which provide, "No parking unless valid and subsisting passes or tickets are displayed on the dashboard of the vehicle in full view through the front windshield thereof.",
	Parking	(ee)	parking meters on highways and parking lots operated by the City,
	Meters Illegal Parking	(ff)	signs indicating that vehicles parked in a designated zone without the proper permit will be towed away by the City pursuant to Part 4 of this Bylaw,
	High Occupancy	(gg)	signs to indicate that a lane is reserved for the exclusive use of high occupancy vehicles , as defined in the <i>Motor Vehicle Act</i> and Regulations thereunder.
	Vehicles Roadway Individual Lane Designation	(hh)	signs and/or pavement markings to regulate traffic on individual travel lane(s) on a roadway to either travel straight through, turn right or turn left or a combination of these movements on an approach to an intersection or public or private driveway.
	Horse Drawn Sightseeing Vehicle Stand	(ii)	signs at locations which identify and direct traffic at horse-drawn sightseeing vehicle stands.
