PART 8 - PEDESTRIAN REGULATIONS

8.1 Sidewalks

8.1.1 <u>Obstructing Public Sidewalks</u>. Subsection 8.1.2 of this Part is not intended to create a result through enforcement that is absurd or unreasonable.

- 8.1.2 <u>Sitting or Lying on Sidewalks</u>. A person must not obstruct a <u>sidewalk</u> by squatting, kneeling, sitting, or lying down on it if the <u>sidewalk</u> abuts a property that is zoned commercial or industrial.
- 8.1.3 <u>Exceptional Circumstances</u>. The prohibition in Subsection 8.1.2 of this Part does not apply to the circumstances that involve any of the following activities or objects:
 - (a) a medical emergency or wheelchair;
 - (b) sitting on a seat at a bus zone while waiting for a bus;
 - sitting on a chair or bench that is supplied by a public agency or an abutting private property owner and that is permitted to occupy a portion of sidewalk pursuant to a permit issued by the City;
 - (d) sitting at a sidewalk café that is permitted to occupy a portion of sidewalk pursuant to a permit issued under Part 7 of this Bylaw;
 - (e) sitting while engaged in the activity which is licensed for that purpose under the Business License and Regulation Bylaw No. 7878;
 - (f) a parade rally, demonstration, performance, or gathering that is permitted by an **outdoor event permit**; or
 - (g) the soliciting of aid by an organisation that holds a valid **permit** issued for that purpose by the **City**.

8.1.4 Pedestrian Traffic Control Pedestrians must obey all traffic control devises placed on or around a sidewalk for the purpose of construction related activities.

8.2 Roadways

- 8.2.1 <u>Obey traffic control devices</u>. Pedestrians must not cross a roadway in contravention of a traffic control device.
- 8.2.2 <u>Walk on sidewalk</u>. Pedestrians shall not walk on the roadway where there is a sidewalk that is reasonably passable on either or both sides of the roadway.
- 8.2.3 No Sidewalk. Where there is no sidewalk, a pedestrian walking along or on a roadway must walk only on the extreme left side of the roadway or on the shoulder of the roadway, facing traffic approaching from the opposite direction.
- 8.2.4 <u>Obstructing traffic</u>. No person shall stand or loiter in such a manner as to obstruct or impede or interfere with **traffic** on a **roadway**.
- 8.2.5 <u>Open liquor prohibited</u>. No pedestrian shall be in possession of open liquor on a highway, sidewalk, walkway or boulevard.
